



Company One Theatre: Teaching Artist

Company One Theatre, in residence at the Boston Center for the Arts, seeks candidates for the position of Teaching Artist in the 2017-18 season. The part-time Teaching Artist will fulfill teaching duties within the Education Department's in-school programs in various Boston Public High Schools for the '17/'18 school year. Part-time schedule possibilities include 1-3 hours of teaching 5 days per week, 6 hours of teaching 2 days per week, etc. This position will report directly to the Education Director but will work closely with Company One Theatre's Education Program Manager, fellow teaching artists, and other Company One Theatre staff. The ideal candidate will be certified to teach theatre in MA, with experience in lesson plan creation and teaching of drama curriculum in grades 9-12.

Candidates who are bilingual in Spanish and from diverse backgrounds and/or traditionally under-represented groups are strongly urged to apply.

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES

- Plan drama curriculum in a high school setting
- Direct instruction and execution of drama curriculum with high school students
- Create end of semester performances of student work
- Assess student performance
- Track and evaluate daily curriculum
- Attend weekly meetings with Education Program Manager
- Attend professional development sessions with fellow teaching artists

REQUIREMENTS:

- BA or BFA, in Theatre or Theatre Ed. preferred
- Experience in playmaking/writing
- Must be motivated by our mission and vision
- Must be willing to embrace the freedom and responsibility required in adapting daily curriculum to suit the needs of the classroom
- Must be able to use a PC and Microsoft Office Suite, Google Docs, and a copier
- Experience teaching in Boston Public Schools a plus
- Experience in multiple performing arts disciplines and certification in Drama or 9-12 Performing Arts are preferred but not required
