Boston, MA - Company One Theatre (C1) presents *The T Party* by Natsu Onoda Power. Performances take place July 15, 2016 through August 13, 2016 at the Nancy and Edward Roberts Studio Theatre (Boston Center for the Arts). The party to redefine all parties is coming to Boston — and you're invited. Ignore the rules. Shake things up. Break the binary. Through an exhilarating series of scenes that blur the line between audience and actors, real stories and fantastical satire, THE T PARTY casts an exuberant, naughty, and surprisingly tender look at gender expression and sexuality. This wild mash-up of a performance will sweep you off your feet and take you for a ride. The only house rule? Leave your expectations at the door.

Natsu Onoda Power returns to Company One Theatre following the run of her Elliot Norton Award-winning *Astro Boy and the God of Comics* in 2015. The multimedia nature of her earlier work takes center stage in THE T PARTY, as scenes, songs, spoken word, projections and videos intertwine to create a spectacular event that launches the audience right into the action. It left D.C. attendees both exhilarated and affected. *The Washington Post* described THE T PARTY as "remarkably inquisitive...A kaleidoscopic exploration of gender issues."

For the first thirty minutes of the performance, THE T PARTY features an off-the-wall interactive experience that invites audiences to step inside the set as partygoers at a prom. Guests are invited to dance and mingle among the cast, creating a unique theatre space and a sense of immediacy that extends throughout the remainder of the performance.

"We are thrilled to be collaborating again with Natsu Onoda Power, an artist of enormous vision and heart. Natsu's approach to performance is unique and unapologetic," says C1 Artistic Director Shawn LaCount. "That spirit energizes all of her work, and it's a joy to be a part of."

Described as "the most original and thought-provoking work I've seen all season" by Victoria Durham of the *MD Theatre Guide*, THE T PARTY carves out a space where expression comes in all colors of the rainbow, and freedom is celebrated. The cast, comprised of Company One veterans and newcomers alike, spans identities that reflect the diverse subject matter of the play.

>>ABOUT THE DIRECTOR & PLAYWRIGHT: Natsu Onoda Power

Natsu Onoda Power is a Washington DC-based playwright/ adapter/ director/ designer. Recent plays include A Trip to the Moon (writer/ director/ illustrator, Synetic Theatre), Astro Boy and the God of Comics (writer/ director, The Studio Theatre; Company One Theatre). Directing credits include David Henry Hwang's Yellow Face (Theatre J) and Young Jean Lee's Songs of the Dragons Flying to Heaven (The Studio Theatre). Her set design has been seen at Company One, Imagination Stage, Forum Theatre, Synetic Theatre, and The Hub Theatre, among others. She is an Associate Professor in the Program in Theater and Performance Studies at Georgetown University, where she has adapted/ directed War with the Newts (adapted from Karek Capek), On the Origin of Species (adapted from Charles Darwin), The Omnivore's Dilemma (adapted from Michael Pollan), Madness and Civilization (adapted from Michael Foucault), and other productions. Natsu holds a Ph.D. in Performance Studies from Northwestern University, and is the author of God of Comics: Osamu Tezuka and the Creation of Post World War II Manga (The University Press of Mississippi, 2009). She is a member of the Forum Ensemble (Forum Theatre) and the Studio Cabinet (The Studio Theatre).
