Boston, MA — [Company One Theatre \(C1\)](#) continues our historic 18th Season with *Really* by Jackie Sibblies Drury. Performances begin Friday, January 25th and continue through February 12th, 2017 at Matter & Light Fine Art in the South End. *Really* marks C1’s second collaboration with Drury after staging the New England premiere of her breakout work *We Are Proud To Present* in 2014.

Please note: *Really* performance dates have shifted since their initial announcement in our season press release. Company One has chosen to postpone the show’s opening to account for the events of Inauguration weekend, specifically the March on Washington, and to encourage political activism on the part of all C1 audiences and supporters.

In a studio filled with photographs, two very different women work to process the disappearance of a charming, volatile artist. But which of them really knew him? Staged in the intimate Matter & Light Fine Art gallery, this striking, lyrical new work follows the people he left behind as they sort through his remaining photos—which offer confounding clues into the person they both loved. Through sound and silence, flash and shutter, *Really* explores the elusive way in which photography freezes a moment in time, and what effect that image has on memory.

For this production, C1 will explore exciting new partnerships with two prominent SoWa galleries. SoWa, regarded as Boston’s leading art community and ranked #2 on USA Today’s

2015 list of 10-Best Art Districts, offers a destination for Company One audiences to examine meaning and memory through art. Audiences will begin their *Really* experience in Gallery Kayafas, with the opportunity to enjoy cocktails and view the gallery’s evocative photography, before transitioning downstairs to Matter & Light Fine Art, which opened its doors in April 2016.

Company One’s production of *Really* marks the first time a theatrical performance has been held in Matter & Light. With a 45-seat house, the gallery provides an intimate space for audiences to interact with the play. Together, theatregoers step inside of the characters’ apartment and photography studio, surrounded by pictures. In correlation with the show, Matter & Light will also exhibit a visual art series titled *Really* that similarly asks guests to determine what makes experiences ‘real.’

“The South End is our home, and we’re beyond excited to partner with our neighbors at Matter & Light and Gallery Kayafas,” says C1 Artistic Director Shawn LaCount. “These partnerships provide a unique opportunity for us to blur the line between audience and stage, and bend the limits of what theatre can be.”

"The question of what exactly art is good for – capturing reality? Evading it? Critiquing it? – is a profound and perennial one," says Ian Marcus Corbin, Director of Matter & Light. "We’re ecstatic to be exploring this question with such a smart, principled group, whose members care so much about the role that art plays in the human story."
